Eligibility Criteria

- Aik Khat Tumharay Naam is open to people aged 18 and above.
- This programme is open to people residing in Pakistan or Pakistani nationals residing in other countries.
- The letter should be an original piece and not an extract from someone else's work.

 The submission should not have been published previously on any social media platform or in print.













We are accepting entries that reflect narratives, perspectives, experiences and emotional states around the COVID-19 pandemic. The work does not need to be directly related to COVID-19 but should consider some of the issues around it. Suggestions for themes include:

- Global contagion and social distancing.
- The world after COVID-19.
- Being in lockdown and its impact on mental health such as depression and isolation (some of the topics that can be addressed include; facing violence and oppression in a range of contexts from domestic to military, economical or racial).
- Working from home and the challenges of balancing work and home life, home-schooling etc.
- Economic difficulties and fear of redundancy.
- Challenges faced by communities, both at national and international level.
- Diet and nutrition.
- Strengthening the family bond, including spending time with the elderly and other family members at home.
- Self-isolation and creativity how lockdowns have forced us into thinking of new ways to keep ourselves and our loved ones entertained.
- Charity and how this time has brought us all together as a community/nation to help the vulnerable.
- Tribute to the real heroes at the frontline of the crisis – thinking about our medical, service industry and security personnel who risk their lives to keep us safe.

NOTE: You may combine one or more of the topics given above. The approach to your letter can be serious or humorous; as in your own style.

Submission Details

- Last date for submission is Friday 8th January 2021.
- Entries to be sent to: olo@olomopolo.com, info@ecdipakistan.org
- Entry should be between 300 1000 words.
- The letter can be submitted in English, Urdu or any of Pakistan's regional languages. Can be a mix of any of these. Let us celebrate being multilingual where we include a mix of languages in the letter.
- The letter can be addressed to anyone or anything.
- If your letter is shortlisted, our team will get in touch with you via email or phone.
 Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted. (Please keep track of your junk emails).
- Please include name, age, phone number, email address and postal address in your entry.

Selection Criteria

- The decision with regards to selection and inclusion rests with the British Council and WOW Pakistan curators only and their decision will be considered final.
- The British Council will retain the right to use the letter/piece submitted but the overall copyright remains with the writer.

Rules

- One entry per person.

- Written piece should be your original work. If not, it will be disqualified.
- No entry will be selected after the deadline.
- Entries with racist, sexist and politically slurred language will be eliminated from consideration.
