

British Council women in STEM scholarships: Frequently Asked Questions

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What does the Scholarship scheme cover?

The British Council Scholarships for Women in STEM includes tuition fees, stipend, travel costs, visa and health coverage fees. The scholarship also has a special support for mothers.

When is the deadline to apply?

Deadline for application differs according to university. The earliest deadline is 14 February 2022 and the latest is 10 April 2022. Please ensure you check carefully on the website of your university of interest for full details of key dates and the application process.

Can women with children apply to the scholarship?

Yes, special support will be given to women travelling with dependent children.

Who can I contact regarding the scholarship?

Which masters are included in the scheme?

Each university has published a list of masters that scholars can apply to. Please refer to the web page of the university for the full list of programmes available.

Is there an age limit to apply?

No, there is no age limit for this scholarship.

Which are the eligible countries?

You have to be a citizen of one of the following countries to apply:

For both Master's Scholarships and Early Academic Fellowships: Bangladesh, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Vietnam

For Masters Scholarships only: Brazil, Egypt, Mexico, Peru, Turkey, Ukraine.

How many scholarships are there?

There are over 100 scholarships available for courses starting in Autumn 2022.

If I did my undergrad degree in the UK, can I apply for the scholarship to do my master's degree?

No, this scholarship is only available for women that have not previously studied in the UK.
